



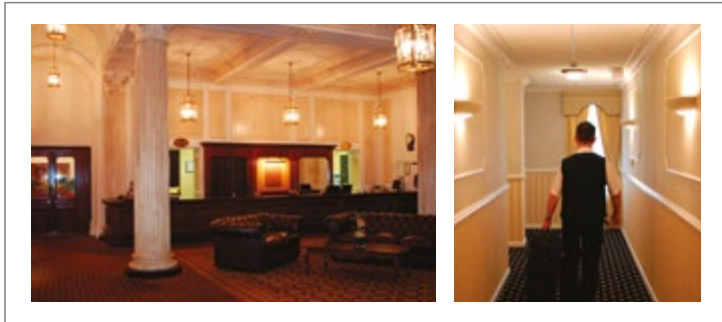

Evenings spent at the Palace are a delicious combination of elegant indulgence, good company and a real sense of occasion.

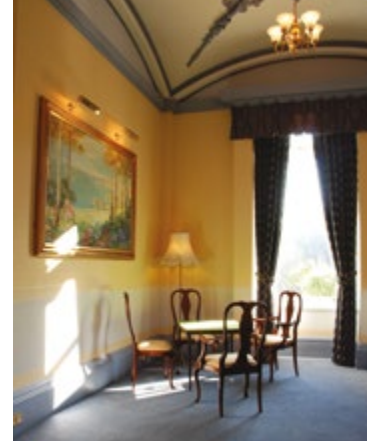

Torquay has, since Victorian times, been a very popular holiday destination.

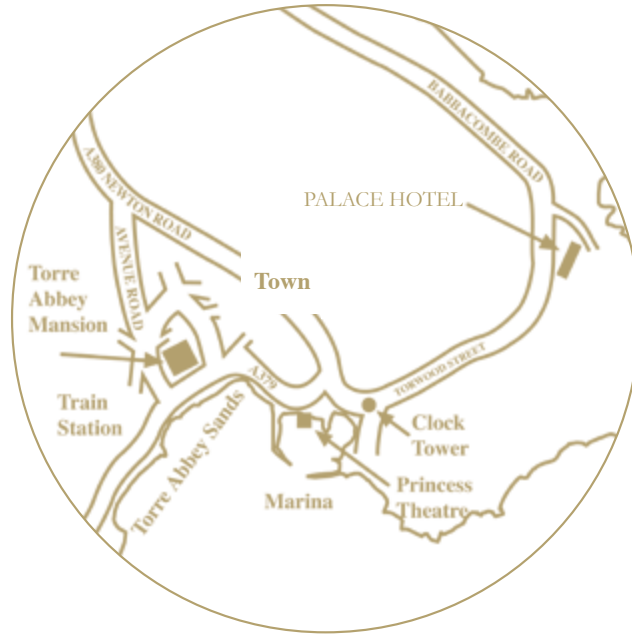
An enviable microclimate influenced by the Gulf Stream encourages tropical plants to flourish and gives this special part of the English Riviera a very distinctive, continental feel.
